It may look a mess right now but the Lomax Construction Company has begun construction on Buildings 300 and 400 in Eastowne. They have already completed the demolition work and the carpet installation. Dry wall, plumbing, electrical and painting are in progress. Once these are complete on each floor, Herman Miller Co. with their partner Alfred-Williams Co. will install the modular furniture and furnish the offices. That will be followed by electrical and network connections. The Town of Chapel Hill requires inspections for Code and Fire prior to occupancy.



The Resolute Construction Company has begun their efforts on Buildings 600, 700 and 200 in Eastowne. Building 600 first floor will house 3 computer labs and the 2nd and 3rd floor are primarily housing the EPIC core team and ISD. ISD Administration and the Helpdesk, in addition to other departments within ISD, will locate to 700. Building 200 will house Patient Accounts.
